

During Wildfires

Take Action Immediately When Wildfire Strikes

- ✓ Review your Evacuation Plan Checklist.
- ✓ Ensure your Grab-N-Go bag is in your vehicle.
- ✓ Cover-up to protect against heat and flying embers:
 - Wear long pants, long sleeved shirt, (100% cotton preferable), heavy shoes/boots, hat, dry bandanna for face cover, N95 facemask, goggles or glasses.
- ✓ Locate your household pets and take them with you.
 - Any horses or large animals should be transported to designated areas.
 - Pierce College at Canoga Ave. & Victory Blvd.

When to Evacuate

- Leave when evacuation is recommended by fire or law enforcement officials to avoid being caught in fire, smoke, or road congestion. **Don't wait to be ordered by the authorities to leave.**
- Officials will determine the areas to be evacuated and escape routes to use depending upon the fire's location, behavior, winds, terrain, etc. **KNOW YOUR ZONEHAVEN ZONE NUMBER.**
- Listen to your radio/TV for announcements from law enforcement and emergency personnel.
- DO NOT return to your home until fire officials determine it is safe. Notification will be given as soon as possible considering safety and accessibility.

When You Return Home

- Be alert for downed power lines and other hazards. NEVER touch downed power lines.
 - **If you see a downed power line, leave the area immediately and call 9-1-1, then call Southern California Edison to report at 1-800-611-1911.**
- If power is still out, DO NOT use open flame items like candles, lighters, lanterns for lighting. Use a flashlight.
- Check for any signs of leaking gas from lines and appliances.
- Check propane tanks, regulators, and lines before turning any gas source on. If you turned your gas off at the meter, CALL SoCalGas to arrange to have it turned back on.
- **DO NOT attempt to turn it back on yourself.**
